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PARKING

Cars – please do avoid driving down Mallard Close (of course unless you are a resident) or a Blue Badge holder. This is for the safety of the 400 children and their families who require access to crossing the road. The Church car park is free and always available. The Spread Eagle car park does charge. Please be aware we cannot assist if a parking ticket or fine is issued. Please can Blue Badge Holders park opposite Gate C.



We await further information from the Highways Agency regarding access to Mallard Close for articulated vehicles. Thank you for respecting our lovely neighbours on Mallard Close.

Uniform and equipment

All children are expected to wear full school uniform. Each child will be provided with their own pencil case containing all the stationery they need to do their work and activities. Children will be able to bring home reading books so school book bags can be brought into school daily.

Children may bring in a water bottle labelled with their name, this should be taken home each day for cleaning. (No fizzy or sport drinks please)

Apologies for the delay in school uniform. We are hoping to receive the order next week. The office will contact you when it has arrived. Children may wear a suitable plain sweater / cardigan until your order arrives.

PE Kit

Children are allowed to wear their PE kit on the days they have their PE lessons. Individual class PE days will be shared with parents via class Dojo. PE kit consists of a white polo t-shirt, navy shorts / navy tracksuit bottoms, black pumps / trainers and Socks. No logos or hoodies.



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Lunch Time

We will continue to run a full school kitchen on our return to school in September. Children will be eating their lunch in the dinner hall. A lunch register will be taken on the first day back, if you wish to make any changes you must email our enquiry address giving at least one week's notice of any changes. Please label your child's lunch box (and uniform!) and water bottle.

Paying for school lunches

If you have to pay for your child's school lunch, this must be done via ParentMail. Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 do not have to pay for school lunch.

Break times

Whilst outside for break times, the children will remain in year group bubbles in a designated area of the school playground. Any equipment used will be cleaned regularly.

Breakfast Club

Reopens on Wednesday 8th September 2021. The club is accessible to **working parents** from Reception to Year 6. Please see previous emails or contact the office for further details. Places are limited to 30 children per day with a daily charge of £1:50. You must pay via ParentMail, weekly in advance. The Breakfast Club contract must be signed prior to your child starting.

Contacting your child's class teacher

Class Dojo/Email

This excellent form of communication will continue to be used. Please can you ensure that you have linked up with your child's new class teacher. Any technical issues please call or email the office. You can also access your child's teacher via email. Please be aware that these cannot be checked throughout the day during teaching time. They are accessed by staff between 8:00am and 8:15am and 3:15pm and 4:00pm.

To assist the smooth running of the end of day if you wish to speak to your child's class teacher please book a telephone appointment with them.



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COVID 19

As restrictions have changed from August 19th 2021 please be aware that we are continuing to follow all DFE and Government Guidelines. School have attended Birmingham Local Authority update training and completed our Outbreak Management Plan.

Covid-19 Government guidance has removed the requirements for some measures of control, but others remain. Hand washing and sanitising will still be a key part of our school routines and the ventilation of classrooms will also be a priority. All members of the school community will be encouraged to operate strict standards of hygiene and not attend if they have symptoms of Covid-19, in which case they should get a PCR test immediately. If your child displays symptoms please follow the guidelines and contact school via the covid@holysoul.bham.sch.uk if your child records a positive result.

Attendance

It is vital that your child is in school every day and on time. We have lost precious time and it is essential that they access all aspects of school life. Following a change to government guidance, there will no longer be the need for large numbers of pupils to isolate following a positive case of Covid-19. In school, we would like all pupils to strive to be in school whenever possible and only be absent if absolutely necessary.

Following the change to self-isolation guidance from 19th August, pupils under the age of 18 and 6 months, are no longer required to self-isolate as a close contact, even if the positive test is from someone in their household, although a PCR will be recommended. Self-isolation is not required whilst waiting for the result of a close contact PCR, unless the test result subsequently comes back positive. Government instructions are now reminding us that parents have a duty to ensure their child attends school regular and that schools must 'follow up' any absence. Government instruction is that persistent non-attendance should be sanctioned in line with local authority codes of conduct. A reminder that this means that if pupil's attendance is less than 90% or on this trajectory, except for Covid-19 absence, we would have to take further action to help this improve.

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Back to School

Five tips to help you be responsible when going back to education to protect yourself and others from COVID -19

1. You are advised to wash your hands, wear a face mask in crowded spaces, and keep your space.

2. Test regularly. You should take two lateral flow test 3-5 days apart

3. You should take a PCR test if a close contact tests positive

4. You should take a test if you have COVID-19 symptoms and self-isolate if you test positive

5. Positive cases identified by NHS test and trace are legally required to isolate

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
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Saturday 5th September is the Feast Day of St Teresa of Calcutta.
