Well done to all of the children and staff for their enthusiasm and creativity this week. You have created beautiful artwork and hopefully increased your confidence with drawing!



Oral History Projects

As part of their Oral History Project the children in Year 4 were visited by Mr Frank Foley who emigrated from Ireland to Birmingham over 60 years ago. He told them all about moving to Birmingham when he was 10 years old, starting work in a factory when he was 13 and how things have changed in the time he has lived here. The children were fascinated by the differences he had experienced in his lifetime. They said:

'He told us so many interesting things about his life'

'I enjoyed how he gave us a bit of a history lesson about what had happened in Ireland'

'He told us loads about the past and the famine in Ireland and how people left Dublin'

Frank left the children with one piece of advice. He said that people being kind to him made it much easier to be a migrant living in Birmingham and he said;

'Be kind to many and often.'
