Confirmation

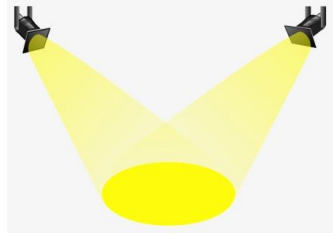
