This very important role has involved three days training by Lynn from Peace makers

During their training they have developed their social and communication skills, they have developed skills for responding to conflict which will be used to help students to strengthen and repair relationships.

I was able to see the children recreate scenarios and show how they would support students to resolve minor disagreements that may arise. I was immensely proud of the children's articulation and knowledge.

The Peace Keepers take up their new roles after half term and will be supporting Year 3 pupils during lunchtimes.



SPOTLIGHT ON SAFEGUARDING

We are constantly talking to our pupils about how we look after each other in school. Ask them to talk to you about the things we do to keep each other safe. They should be able to tell you:

In school every child has a Trusted Adult who they have chosen to be there for them if they wish to share anything.

We use See it, Hear it, Say it, Stop it - where all pupils and adults have a responsibility to speak up and speak out.

We also use THINK... as a reflection following an incident or upset which allows the children time to tell the Truth, and think if their actions were Helpful, Inspiring, Necessary and Kind. This is part of a restorative approach with forgiveness and reconciliation at the heart of the matter. We talk about the actions we take and the consequences that they have and how we all have a responsibility to respect one another and take care of each other.
