
John Chil8 v 33-37

<u>Importance of Attendance</u>

Research commissioned by the Department for Education, shows missing school for even a day can mean a child is less likely to achieve good grades, which can have a damaging effect on their life chances.

Think about these questions:

I.If my child has time off at primary school, does it make that much difference?

2.They can catch up eventually, can't they?

3.So a couple of days off isn't that much work missed, is it?

If your child misses school, they miss lessons which may not be repeated. Being absent from school makes it hard to catch up with missed work and effects how well children do:

How much lesson time do they miss when they are off?

·Half day absent = 3 hours of lessons missed.
·I day absent = 5 hours of lessons missed.
·3 days absent = 15 hours of lessons missed.
·I week absent = 25 hours of lessons missed.
·2 weeks absent = 50 hours of lessons missed.

The possible impact for your child.

·They might feel a bit left out.

·They may not know how to do the work.


·They may fall behind and find it difficult to catch up.

·They may have to make friends again.

Finally, here is what it all adds up to:

If your child continues through their whole school life only attending 90% or less every year then their GCSE results WILL be affected, see below what the chances are:-

Full Attendance	100%	82% of students achieve 5+ Good GCSE Grades
Good Attendance	97% - 99.9%	79%of students achieve 5+ Good GCSE Grades
Attendance Requires Improvement	96.9% - 95%	53% of students achieve 5+ Good GCSE Grades
Worrying Attendance	94.9% - 90%	45% of students achieve 5+ Good GCSE Grades
Serious Concern	Below 90%	36% of students achieve 5+ Good GCSE grades

School Referrals for Autism and / or ADHD

Important message from NHS Birmingham Community Healthcare:

Leading on from the newsletter before the half-term holidays, school are no longer able to send referrals for autism and / or ADHD if there has not been evidence of Early Help or Graduated Approach to support the child or young person.

Evidence of Early Help or the Graduated Approach **must** have been implemented over a **minimum of two terms** for school to send a referral.

If there is no Early Help or Graduated Approach to support the child or young person in place or the evidence detailed is inadequate the referral will be rejected.

If you have spoken to Mr Henvey regarding school sending a referral for either autism or ADHD for your child, please contact him after the half-term holiday.

The rights that Christians are losing include:


- their home


