Prevent Duty Statement.

Building Pupils' resilience to radicalisation by:

- promoting fundamental British values;

Risk Assessment

- Risk assessment is very low. We have a community which has a range of cultures and faith/non-faith (predominantly Catholic).
- Relationships between children, children and grown-ups, between grown-ups are healthy and inclusive.
- No evidence has been presented that groups or individuals feel excluded and therefore at increased risk/vulnerability of radicalisation. We are a primary school.
- We strongly advise parents about our children being too young to access social media and deal robustly with any incident of inappropriate use of IT immediately with children and families. Our staff have regularly updated training and are astute to changes in child behaviour. Staff are conscientiously aware of their duty to report any concerns to the DSL.
- The DSL will refer to guidance on Channel if there is a concern that child behaviours are of this nature.

Working In partnership

Our school works in partnership with: Birmingham's local Safeguarding Children Board (LSCB), Social Care and Health, parents and family members to respond appropriately to any concerns raised. Our school will refer to The Prevent Duty, June 2015 Publication for contact numbers regarding any concern relating to extremism directly.

Staff Training.

John Needham trained our staff in June 2015 through the 'Workshop to Raise Awareness of Prevent' (WRAP).

The DSL attends training updates for 1.5 days each term regarding safeguarding matters; including timely and relevant INSET e.g. Autumn Term 2015 CTU presentation.

The governing body reviews the level of training annually through the section 175 audit and plans further training accordingly.

The DSL and safeguarding governor i.e. headteacher and chair of governors meet termly to review safeguarding actions and plan ahead accordingly.

ICT Policies.

Our school's ICT is provided by Link2ICT including all of its filtering practices. Our curriculum teaches our children about internet safety and staying safe online.
